SEASON SUMMARY



With the worst of the pandemic behind us, we undertook our first season of (almost) completely live performances! We were overjoyed to reclaim our status as Milwaukee's Microbrewery for Opera,

producing a big ol' batch of the newlycommissioned works and adaptations of the classics that you've come to know and love. Thank you for taking the journey with us.

This season, we produced, or co-produced Night of the Living Opera (Concert Reading), The Meaning of Christmas, Requiem, Rusalka, Impossible Operas, and Magnificent Bird.

Plus, we hosted 4 Voice Labs, continued our Script & Score education initiative at Parkside School for the Arts, and began the Supreme Creativity Studio, a brand new education program in which we partnered with MPS Music Teacher Meaghan Heinrich to teach songwriting and collaborative skills to two classes of 5th graders at Neeskara Elementary School!

THE NUMBERS

With a healthy box office and generous support from grants and individual donors, we were able to end our season in the black, as we have done each year since we were founded.

We reached an audience of over 3,266 (and counting!)

We produced, or co-produced, 28 performances

\$55,892 we spent on those performances,

\$39,200

was paid directly to artists in fees, stipends, and commissions.

94%

was spent on local talent, supporting our bedrock belief that investing in area talent creates a thriving community.

SEASON REVIEW

In **October 2022**, we produced the world premiere of *Night of the Living Opera*, an operatic adaptation of the classic horror film, in a concert reading. Conceived by MOT alums Josh and Julianne Perkins — along with Denver-based composer Andrew Dewey — *Night of the Living Opera* featured haunting music and lifesized zombie puppets courtesy of our friends at Angry Young Men, Ltd. We're so excited to premiere the fully-staged version of this new opera next season!

In **December 2022**, we unveiled our contribution to the Decameron Opera Coalition's new holiday album, a short video opera entitled *The Meaning of Christmas*. Pulling from Milwaukee's robust talent pool, we were delighted to work with longtime MOT collaborator Adam Qutaishat as composer/lyricist and to forge a new relationship with local illustrator Eric Miranda to create this one-of-a-kind animated holiday treat!

In **January 2023**, we were honored to join forces with one of Milwaukee's preeminent choral ensembles, Chant Claire, to premiere a new Requiem by beloved local composer Paula Foley Tillen. At over 50 voices strong, Chant Claire was joined by pianist Julie Fraleigh and MOT soloists Lydia Rose Eiche, Nathan Wesselowski, and Gladys Rhodes Chmiel to breathe life into this lovingly rendered tribute to loss, grief, and hope.

In **February 2023**, we teamed up with our recurrent collaborative partner Danceworks MKE, to present Dvořák's classic opera *Rusalka* in a new streamlined adaptation. Created by local favorite singer-songwriter Jason Powell (who also narrated the show playing The Moon), the production featured performances by some of Milwaukee's favorite singers, including Saira Frank, Colleen Brooks, Tim Rebers, and David Guzmán, joined by eight Danceworks dancers to bring the tale of Rusalka's doomed love to Milwaukee audiences for the first time.

In **May 2023**, we assembled the team of intrepid theater artist Jeffrey Mosser, Quasimondo Physical Theatre Artistic Director Brian Rott, and shadow puppeteer extraordinaire Anja Notanja Sieger to premiere *Impossible Operas*, a compendium of snippets from eight of the most absurd, fantastical, or otherwise impossible operas in the repertoire. Told in song, movement, and shadow puppetry, *Impossible Operas* was unlike anything Milwaukee audiences had ever seen (or are likely to see again!).

And on **May 31 & June 1, 2023**, we closed our season by partnering with Present Music to present *Magnificent Bird*, a live performance of renowned singersongwriter Gabriel Kahane's new album of the same name exploring what it means to be a traveler through the changing landscape of the 21st century.
